JOURNALISM CLUB: As part of an effort to empower young writers and encourage student expression, the Lester B. Pearson School Board is introducing a pilot project for a Journalism Club (J-Club) designed to introduce students to the world of reporting, writing, and publishing. The J-Club will be led by two distinguished LBPSB alumni who are currently working in Montreal as journalists, Felicia Parrillo of Global News Montreal and Sean Henry of CBC News Montreal, Pearson News reports. Felicia is a graduate of John Rennie High School while Sean graduated from LaSalle Community Comprehensive High School. Their real-world experience will guide students through different steps of the journalistic process—from researching and interviewing to crafting articles and editorials. "I hope the J-club becomes a place where students feel inspired to explore, ask questions and tell stories that reflect their world. Journalism helps you connect with people and see things from new perspectives – and I can't wait to see students discover that," said Felicia.

As part of a pilot project, the J-club will be open to students with an interest in writing, communications, or media. Workshops will take place during lunch-hour with additional ones planned throughout the year at LBPSB-schools that demonstrate an interest in participating in the J-Club. The first workshop is scheduled to take place at JRHS. A second workshop open to all LBPSB high school
