I remember attending my gym classes with my adaptive walker and my teachers would duct tape a hockey stick to my walker so I could play stick hockey with everyone else. My classmates would constantly pass me the ball and I would score goals.

There are too many teachers that had an influence on me to name them all and I'm so fortunate to have been surrounded by such supportive and inclusive staff.

My favorite memories were made at leadership camp. This was a 3-day trip that was held every year where aspiring leaders would unite and learn the necessary skills to lead various activities. This is also where I learned to step out of my comfort zone. Every year at camp, I would give a presentation in front of hundreds of students and tell them about myself, my anxieties, my insecurities, my interests, etc... This would showcase my humility and the students would then understand how to interact with me and include me in the activities.

John Rennie has played a pivotal role in shaping the person I am today. I now run a nonprofit business with Danny called <u>All Access Life</u>, an organization that aims to

empower people with disabilities and make our world more accessible.
