Progressive Entry

What is a progressive entry?

For the first week of school, your child will follow a "progressive entry" schedule. This means that they will not attend full days of school right away. Rather, they will slowly be introduced to the routines of maternelle over the course of multiple days.

Progressive entry is designed to help ease children into school. "Big school" can be overwhelming, especially in the beginning. There are a lot of new routines to learn, new people to meet, and new rules to follow.

Breaking the transition to school into smaller amounts of time, over multiple days, helps to lighten to emotional and cognitive load on our young students.

This also means that for the first week of school, less maternelle students will be attending school at the same time. Teachers can therefore give more attention to individual students, easing the "back to school jitters" as they arise.

French Immersion

Maternelle French Immersion Program

In kindergarten, your child will follow a French Immersion program: 85% of instruction will be delivered in French. This means that throughout the day, lessons, activites, and projects will be done in French. Teaching during physical education classes and library periods will be done in English.

The kindergarten teachers use a variety of tools to help your child develop an understanding of the French language: Songs, stories, vocabulary lessons, and exposure to the French language help young students to develop early comprehension and communication skills.


If your child enters kindergarten without knowing how to speak in French, don't worry. We're here to help! In September, we take a bilingual approach to ease your child into school life. Making students feel comfortable and at ease during this important transition is our top priority during the first weeks of school. As time progresses, we gradually introduce more French into the program, focusing on helping students build comprehension skills and the ability to repeat common phrases in French (such as "Est-ce que je peux aller à la toilette?").

August Letter

What information can I expect to receive in August?

In August, the school will be mailing out more specific information regarding the 2020-2021 school year. In the August information, you will receive:

- Possible updates regarding the ever-unfolding COVID-19 situation.
- Your child's progressive entry schedule. The students will be divided into groups and will come to school on their specific days, at their specific times.
- Transportation information and a form for you to fill out about your child's regular after school routines (will your child be attending daycare after school, will they take the bus home at the end of the school day, or will they be picked up at the gate by a family member or guardian?). Please keep your child's after school routine as regular as possible. For example, if they attend daycare after school, it is best that they do so every day of the week.

The First Weeks of School

What will my child's first weeks of school entail?

During your child's first week of school, they will follow their progressive entry schedule.

- Your child will not be assigned a specific teacher before arriving in August. Throughout the first two weeks, they will be introduced to the different classrooms and the different kindergarten teachers.
- Your child will learn the routines of class.
- Your child will socialize with the other children in maternelle.
- Your child will work on simple craft projects.
- After the first two weeks of school, your child will be assigned a homeroom teacher and will remain in that class for the 2020-2021 school year. You will be officially notified of your child's placement.



Smooth Transition

Is your child feeling ready? Anxious? Scared? Here are some tips before your child starts school

- Talk about school in a positive way; share your happy memories with your child.
- Read books about kindergarten.
- Foster your child's independence (for example, let them practice getting dressed).
- Start a regular routine in the week before school starts (move towards a "school year" routine, earlier bedtime, routine lunch and snack time).

- Have your child's hearing and sight checked before starting school.


Don't worry... children come to school at different levels and learn in due time. We are here to help them, and you, through this transition.


