The music component of the Quebec Education Program includes three competencies:

At Beacon Hill, music is for everyone! Our students experience music through song, rhythm, dance, various musical instruments, and group performances.

- Grades K-3: students are introduced to the foundation of music through games, dancing, singing and creative composition using various instruments.
- Grade 4: Compose and perform music using different apps and technology.
- Grade 5: Compose and perform music using Orff instruments and ukuleles.
- Grade 6: Students learn Brass and Woodwind instruments along with creating unique composition projects.
- The Beacon Hill Choir is designed for students in grades 3-6. This is an extra-curricular lunchtime activity.

Classroom activities include:

Cooperative games, puppetry, tableaux, improvisation, script writing and reflecting on the dramatic process, group performance, soliloquy, and multi-media productions.

Students in various grade levels perform during school assemblies and students in grade six take part in a theatrical musical in the springtime, in conjunction with the school's choir.
