
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Conceptual understanding

Language and identity


MYP students are required to learn at least 2 languages. Learning to communicate in a variety of ways is fundamental to their development of intercultural understanding.


We offer a variety of courses that place students into a level of mathematics with appropriate challenges and successes.

Our department is the only one in the Lester B. Pearson School Board that offers Secondary IV students the Applied Science and Technology Course in combination with the Science and the Environment course to prepare them for Physics and Chemistry in Secondary V.

Ethics Department

The Ethics and Religious Culture course (ERC) provides students with an opportunity to reflect upon current issues and to develop the skills required for ethical decision-making and dialogue. The course covers Quebec's religious heritage and world religions. Guest speakers, activities and field trips related to the ethics course take place throughout the year.





Social Studies

Journey into the past to better understand your present and future!

Cycle I students will travel from prehistory all the way to the modern day. In Cycle II, they will learn more about Quebec and Canada. In grade 11, students are invited to become world citizens by studying 20th century history and current events.

Cooking & Nutrition

Cooking & Nutrition is offered at grade 9 and 11. The course is designed to help improve a student's comfort, knowledge and independence in the kitchen. Students learn the basics of cooking, preparation techniques, reading recipes, and food & kitchen safety. Guest chefs are invited to the class to provide further culinary insight.

Drama program

The drama program promotes personal and social development, encourages students to explore and express their identity, to experience the dramatic art and to develop awareness and appreciation for the arts. Furthermore, practical and transferable skills, such as critical thinking, expression, peer collaboration, risk-taking and self-reflection are promoted.

Topics covered in Drama Secondary 3-5:

The number of topics include: introduction to stage rules, silent and narrative performances, improvisational acting, short script productions, study of dramatic texts, monologues, musical

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theatre, technical theatre production, film and multi-media, play production and field trips to experience live theatre.

Music Department

The St. Thomas Music Department offers music classes to all grades, regardless of student ability. We are pioneers in the classroom use of SmartMusic and EMedia digital technology. Our instrumental music and acoustic guitar programs promote values of creation and self-exploration. St. Thomas boasts the first DRUMLINE in the LBPSB and two award-winning Jazz bands – both open to all St Thomas students.
