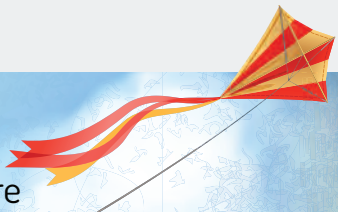
The Lester B. Pearson School Board is committed to helping each student achieve his/her potential and values a close partnership with parents in the education of their child.

HOW CAN I HELP MY CHILD?

- Be involved in the Kindergarten experience as much as you can.
- Keep in contact with your child's teacher to stay informed about his/her progress.
- Talk with your child about his/her experiences in Kindergarten.
- Encourage your child through at-home activities, such as bedtime reading, listening to music, making decisions by offering choices, drawing, cutting and doing puzzles.

GETTING READY FOR KINDERGARTEN

Take advantage of our open houses, and bring your child with you. You can meet teachers, and your child can become familiar with the school.

BEFORE THE FIRST DAY

In the weeks leading up to school, practice walking to school or to the bus stop, so it begins to feel like a regular routine. If your child will be riding the bus, please go over the following bus safety rules a few times:

- Remain seated, talk quietly.
- Do not eat or drink on the bus.
- Always listen to the driver's instructions.
- Be polite and courteous.

THE FIRST DAY

Maintain your usual morning routine.

When you say goodbye to your child on the first day, make it quick, light and reassuring. He/She will be reassured by a warm hug and a reminder that you will either be picking him/her up, waiting at the bus stop or at home after school is finished.

As a parent, you may find this day a little tough. This is normal. Try not to convey to your child any feelings of sadness that you may experience. Sometimes planning something special for yourself during the first few days helps. Kindergarten is a very special time for both children and parents!

DAYCARE SERVICES

Our school board offers quality school-based daycare services subsidized by the Ministry of Education (Ministère de l'Éducation, Enseignement Supérieur et Recherche) is offered on school days before class, usually opening by 7:00 A.M., at lunch and after school until 6:00 P.M. In addition, services may be available on pedagogical days provided a sufficient number of students are registered.

School daycares operate on a ratio of 20 students to 1 daycare educator. Our services are organized and supervised by qualified staff. We provide a program of activities that complements the learning that takes place in the classroom. We pride ourselves in providing a safe and caring environment.

PROGRAM CHOICE

The territory of the LBPSB is divided into a number of geographical catchment areas called Attendance Zones. Within an Attendance Zone, students are given a choice of enrolling in a school that provides one of the following programs: a Bilingual, Early Immersion or Français Plus Program. ELIGIBILITY FOR ENGLISH EDUCATION
