## LESTER B. PEARSON SCHOOL BOARD 2022-2023 BUDGET

At the September 19th, 2022 Council of Commissioners meeting, the Lester B. Pearson School Board adopted a deficit budget of \$ 578,267 with \$352,412,558 in revenues and \$352,990,825 in expenses. The school board consults with stakeholders and prioritizes school and centre needs to ensure we follow the school board's vision of achieving excellence by maximizing the potential of each individual.

June 30th 2022 was the expiration of school bus transportation contracts for most school boards in Quebec. Over the summer, the Quebec government and the Bus Carriers Federation negotiated a modified financing model for school transportation. The new model does not take into account all of the school transportation costs associated with the transportation of students who travel long distances to their closest school. As the Lester B. Pearson School Board covers a large territory, the new agreement has left the board with a \$578,267 projected deficit in transportation financing. The school board will work with the ministry of education to address this shortfall so as to not divert classroom financing to transportation financing.

The Lester B. Pearson School Board continues to implement new initiatives to benefit students and employees including:

- An additional \$800,000 in funding from the ministry for teacher mentoring. Eight teacher posts have been allocated throughout elementary, secondary and continuing education to provide support to new teachers to improve teacher retention and teacher efficacy;
- The school board has opened a third point of service for students in the REACH program. REACH is a
  specialized program providing children aged 5-7 with a safe, nurturing, highly structured classroom
  environment where they can develop the foundational academic, social-emotional, and behavioral skills
  necessary for success in school. REACH North has opened at Terry Fox elementary school, joining REACH
  East at Lasalle Jr. elementary school and REACH West at Christmas Park elementary school;
- · Additional funding for providing meals to students in the youth sector;
- Increased cybersecurity threat detection and response with training for users;
- Improved internet connectivity;
- · New boilers at LaSalle Senior to improve energy efficiency;
- Replacing of parking lots at Edgewater and Pierrefonds Community High School with the installation of charging stations for electric vehicles to be completed during the school year.
